Description of the Manors of Worksop and the Priory

Before I being to express the particulars of these manors, it will not be amiss to relate something concerning the royalties, profits and commodities belonging to the same. And first for the manor or Worksop (which in times past did belong to the right honourable family of the Shrewsbury's) where is kept a Court Baron, once every 3 weeks if occasion serves and a Court Leet twice every year.

Within this manor or Lordship is a very spacious park, being seven miles and a half and half a quarter in compass and contains by measure according to the statute 2302 acres, 2 roods and 314/5 perches. About in the middle there stands a very stately house called the manor, built of freestone, being very pleasantly situated upon a hill, with corresponding gardens to the same.

About half a mile from the said mansion is another house fairly built of stone and well contrived called the new lodge, besides the old lodge where the keeper dwells.

This park is well adorned with timber and not meanly furnished with fallow deer, the number of them at present is about eight hundred. There is a little river running through this park, very profitable, not only in regard to trout and other fish therein contained; but especially in regard of the water mill, well built of stone, standing upon the said river, near the park and the town of Worksop: in which said town there is a market kept every Wednesday and one fair yearly and that is upon the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March.

There is also within these manors very good meadow ground with pastures and arable lands, and some heath fit for no other purpose but for the maintaining of sheep.

Near to this town of Worksop has been a castle in times past, but there is nothing remaining there, but only a hill where the castle stood.

I cannot here omit that thing wherein this town of Worksop excels all others within this realm and most noted for: I mean the store of liquorice that grows there and that of the best. If you look into the bowels of the earth you shall find very good quarrys of stone for building, and limestone for the making of lime not only for necessary uses in building, but especially for the manuring of grounds.

There has been in times past adjoining Worksop church, a Priory with a manor there belonging, but the court is discontinued, and now for the most part they are brought to do service at the court belonging to Worksop manor.

There is within this manor a great oak, very remarkable, called Shireoak, in regard that the branches extend themselves into three shires, viz,

Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire. There are divers lands lying in several places remote from these manors, that are also under the charge of the bailiff of Worksop, whereof there is one place above the rest more worthy of being noted, that is a great standing water called White Water, lying in Styrrup in the parish of Blyth, about four or five miles from the aforesaid manors, which will afford a great store and variety of fish and fowl being no less pleasurable than profitable.

**James Bland**, glazier and plumber, for keeping the leads, water-work and windows in repair, his wages per annum £10  
Note that the said James is to find the solder, but the lead is to be found him ready for his work

**William Poynton**, for looking to and mending the park pale, his wages per annum £4

Sum total £73 6s 8d

Sum total of all the reprises aforesaid issuing out the said manors and lands is £86 6s 8d

Sum total of the clear remainder, the reprises and payments being deducted out the whole revenue of the said manors and lands contained within this survey £975 3s 6 1/2d and 36 capons, 2 hens and a fish of old ling.

Uncertain profits omitted, as the toll of the fair, for ling, wind fallen wood and other offal wood, mast in the park and other woods, heriots, strays, perquisites of court, felons goods and the like, which are every year more or less and therefore I have omitted them.

Uncertain disbursement omitted is dressing of meadows, mowing of grass and making hay, pailing, railings, hedging and ditching, browsing for deer, smith work, repairs, woodcutting for the manor house and for other uses, court charges and other expenses which are every year more or less and therefore I have omitted them.

Worksop Manor, the demesnes lying within the park

**The Right Honourable Thomas, Earl of Arundel and Surrey** etc is Lord of this manor and has at this present in his own hands, the manor or mansion house with the site thereof, and so much of the demesnes thereto belonging lying within the park as are hereafter particularly expressed

Particulars

First, the manor or mansion house called Worksop manor, being a very stately building of freestone and all offices thereto belonging together with outhouses; also three gardens with fruit trees therein, two courts and a yard lying altogether about the middle of Worksop Park and contained together are 7 acres, 2 roods and 6 perches.

Item, a close of pasture called the Wilderness lying on the east side of the site of the said manor and containing 34 acres, 1 rood, 10 perches.

Item, that part of Worksop park called the open park, which is reserved for the deer and for the juisting of cattle and containing 1675 acres, 0 roods, 8 perches.

Item, the hall close within the park next to the forest lane in part towards the east and next to the part of the open park called the old Hall close towards the south. This is juisted with cattle and containing 58 acres, 2 roods, 38 perches.

Sum total 1889 acres, 3 roods, 34 perches

**Francis Tonge** holds in regard of his office being park keeper these that follows, particulars, first, the Old Lodge with a barn and stable and yard, lying near to the little Dewes Green, yet the open park lies round about it. And it contains 1 acres, 0 roods, 28 perches.

Item, Great Dewes Green lies between Little Dewes Green in part towards the east and Darfoulds towards the west and abuts upon the open park towards the south. Note that the deer have liberty to feed in the piece without control.

It contains 57 acres, 1 rood, 5 perches. Sum total 58 acres, 1 rood, 33 perches.

Tenants at Will in Worksop Park:

**William Canning** holds at the will of the Lord the Nether Lawn by the yearly rent of £21. The said close of pasture called the Nether Lawn, lying next to the Wilderness in part and the Great Lawn in part towards the south west, and the open park towards the north west and containing 76 acres, 2 roods, 26  $\frac{3}{10}$  perches.

**Richard Harrison** holds a part of the Lawn and the Dam Stead at will by the yearly rent of £19 10s. Particulars, firstly a meadow being a part of the lawn lying as the last piece does and abutting upon the last piece towards the south and containing 1 acres, 1 rood, 35 perches.

Item, another meadow being also part of the Lawn and lying as the last piece does and abutting upon the last piece towards the south and containing 3 acres, 1 rood, 37 perches.

Item, a piece of moorish ground called Dam Stead lying as the last piece does and abutting upon the last piece towards the south and containing 3 acres, 1 rood, 2  $\frac{3}{5}$  perches.

Item, a close of pasture called Lady Lee lying between the lands of Richard Kirkbey towards the north and the Open Park in part and Little Dewes Green par towards the south and abutting upon the last piece towards the east and Great Dewes Green towards the west and containing 29 acres, 2 roods, 15 perches. Sum total, 97 acres, 1 rood, 19 perches.

**Francis Tonge** holds at will Little Dewes Green by the yearly rent of 40 shillings. Particulars, a close of pasture called Little Dewes Green lying between the open park towards the east and Great Dewes Green towards the west and abutting Lady Lee towards the north and containing 13 acres, 0 roods, 15 perches.

**James Hattersley** holds a cottage, a barn and a garden at will lying in Worksop Park near to Darfoulds Lane end by the yearly rent of 4 shillings.

Sum total of all the demesnes lying in the park is 2302 acres, 2 roods, 31 4/5 perches.

#### Worksop Lands Lying without the Park of Worksop Manor

Worksop Manor. **The Right Honourable Thomas Earl of Arundell and Surrey** has at present in his own hands a parcel of pasture and wood called Jack Riding, which now lies to the common but the Lord may inclose it when he pleases, lying between that part of Gateford Moor called Callsmithes towards the north and a common called Tranker Common towards the south, and abutting upon lands of Sir George Lassells as well towards the east and west and containing 8 acres, 1 rood, 20 perches.

Worksop For Years

**William Roades** holds by lease in the right of Elizabeth his wife, one toft late the lands of Law Junior who was convicted of felony and suffered death for the same and so his lands were forfeited to the Lord, but the said lands were leased out for almost a hundred years by the said Law before his death, and

therefore the Lord has only, as I take it, the old rent until the lease be ended, which old rent or chief rent, I think, was yearly 12d. Particular, first, the site of his tenement containing a dwelling house of 3 bays, a cottage of 2 bays, a barn of 2 bays, a fold and a garden lying at the town end between the lands of Christopher Champion towards the north and Richard Hatfield towards the south, and abutting upon the moor towards the east and Roger Pilsworth towards the west. Item, a piece of arable land lying in Adam Close between the moor towards the east and the lands later Mr Needham's towards the west and abutting upon the said moor towards the north and the lands of Christopher Champion towards the south and containing 0 acres, 3 roods, 12 perches. Item, a close called Far Adams Close lying between the lands of Richard Hatfield towards the east and Wetmoore Common in part, and a close called the Nether Holme in part towards the west and abutting upon the lands of Roger Pilsworth towards the south and containing 2 acres, 1 rood, 31 perches. Sum total 3 acres, 1 roods, 3 perches.

Item, a piece of arable land lying in Worksop Field between the Lord's land in the use of Francis Tonge towards the north and the lands of Sir Thomas Hewitt south and abutting Botham Way east and Gateford Way west and containing 2 roods, 8  $\frac{2}{5}$  perches.

Item, a piece of arable land lying in Worksop Field between the lands of Sir George Lassells north and the Lord's land in the use of Francis Tonge south and abutting as the last piece does and containing 1 acre, 1 rood, 16 perches.

**Mr John Flower** holds the Lathfould with a barn and an ox house of 7 bays lying between the Tenter Green towards the north east and Worksop Park towards the south west and containing 1 rood, 33  $\frac{1}{2}$  perches.

**Thomas Thropum** holds at will a cottage and a garden lying in Newgate Lane next a toft of the Lord's in the use of William Canning and pays a yearly rent of 5 shillings.

**The Widow Harrison** holds at will a cottage on Tenter Green adjoining to the Castle Hill by a yearly rent of 12 pence.

**William Kirkeby** holds at will a cottage standing upon Tenter Green adjoining to Castle Hill at a yearly rent of 18 pence.

**Thomas Crumwell** for Lime pits, a yearly rent of 5 shillings.

**Richard Hatfield** for Lime pits per annum 12 shillings.

**John Dunston** for Lime pits per annum 6 shillings 8 pence.

**Mr John Flower** holds the Castle Dykes and the Mill meadow at will by the yearly rent of £12. Particulars, first, a pasture called Castle Hill and the Dykes being part of the old park lying between Tenter Green towards the south east and Mill Lane towards the west and abutting upon the Lord's lands in the use of Joane Gladwin north and containing 5 acres, 3 roods, 12 perches.

Item, another part of the Nether Town Fields lying between the last piece in part and another part of the said fields in the use of Ralph Armeffield in part towards the north and a sheep walk towards the south and abutting Manton grounds towards the east and a part of Nether Town Fields in the use of Grigory Stern towards the west and containing 47 acres, 2 roods, 20 perches. Sum total 64 acres, 0 roods, 3 perches.

**Thomas Mychell** holds at will certain land by the yearly rent of £42 and 4 capons. Particular, first a meadow called Fyrmery Yards lying between Priorwell Meadow towards the north and Longwall Way south and abutting upon a tenement of the Lord's in the use of John Templeman east and the old church yard in part west and containing 12 acres, 0 roods, 9 perches.

Item, a close called Little Gods Croft lying next to a close called Rushy Close towards the east and abutting upon Hawood Lane north and Long Close in part towards the south and containing 6 acres, 0 roods, 34 perches.

Item, a close of arable called Gods Croft lying next to the last piece towards the east and abutting upon the Longwall Way towards the north and the Long Close towards the south and containing 10 acres, 2 roods, 24 perches.

Item, another close called Gods Croft lying between the last piece towards the east and the lands of Sir Thomas Hewitt west and abutting upon the Longwall Way north and containing 9 acres, 1 rood, 20 perches.

Item, another close of arable land lying next to the lands of Sir Thomas Hewitt in part and Nether Town Lane in part towards the west and abutting upon the last piece towards the north and Nether Town Fields south and containing 15 acres, 1 rood, 21 perches.

Item, a close called Long Close lying between Gods Croft towards the north and the Nether Town Field towards the south and abutting upon the last piece towards the west and containing 19 acres, 3 roods, 14 perches.

Item, a close called the Row of Oaks lying between the Nether Town Field towards the east and south and Hawood Lane in part and Rushy Close in part north and the last piece west and containing 21 acres, 1 rood, 14 perches.

Item, a close of pasture called Hawood lying between the river in part and Hawood meadow in part north and Hawood Lane south and abutting upon Manton grounds east and Jesus House Yards in part and Nether Meadow in part west and containing 39 acres, 3 roods, 31 perches.

Sum total 134 acres, 3 roods, 7 perches.

There is due to the Lord on the death of every of them dying tenant in possession 20 shillings for 2 Heriots.

**Henry Cole** holds at will all that messuage or tenement called Jesus House and Manton with the appurtenances in Worksop by the yearly rent of £45. Particulars, first the site of the tenement called Jesus House being moated about and containing 6 bays and 2 hay houses, a stable, an ox house, a garden and a fold lying next to the Nether Meadow towards the north and the Highway towards the west and containing 0 acres, 3 roods, 34  $\frac{1}{10}$  perches.

Item, a piece of pasture called Jesus House Yards lying on the east side of the tenement next to the Nether Meadow north, a close called Hawood east and Hawood Lane south and containing 2 acres, 3 roods, 35  $\frac{2}{5}$  perches.

Item, another tenement called Manton containing a little dwelling house and an ox house under one roof, a barn of 5 bays, a fold and a close called Griffines lying in 3 parts between the river towards the north and Manton Lane towards the south and abutting upon Hawood west and containing 17 acres, 0 roods, 26 perches.

Item, a close of pasture and arable lying on the east end of the said tenement between the river and the lands of Mr Robert Eayre towards the north and Radford Way south and abutting upon the lands of the late Mr Bowles east and containing 66 acres, 0 roods, 16 perches.

Item, a close of arable land lying between the last piece north and Manton sheep walk south and abutting upon the lands of the Late Mr Thomas Bowles east and containing 172 acres, 1 rood, 3  $\frac{3}{5}$  perches.

Item, a close of arable land lying between the last piece east and Nether Town Field west and abutting upon Manton Lane towards the north and containing 100 acres, 2 roods, 3 perches.

Item, Manton sheep walk lying between the last pieces towards the north and the Lord's wood in part and the lands of the late Mr Bowles called Clumber in part towards the south and abutting upon the lands of the Earl of Newcastle called Hardwick Grange in part and the lands of the late Mr Bowles in the other part towards the east and a sheep walk of the Lord's in the use of John Flower towards the west and containing 924 acres, 1 rood, 2 perches.

Sum total 1284 acres, 1 rood, 0  $\frac{1}{10}$  perches.

There is due to the Lord on the death of every of them dying tenant in possession £5 Nomine Heriot.

Sum total of all the lands aforesaid belonging to the Prior Manor is 2333 acres, 2 roods, 19 perches.

Commons belonging both to the manor of Worksop and the Priory as follows,

First, two commons called Wet Moor and Cole Moor, parts thereof belonging to Worksop and the other part to the Priory. These commons both together

and northward from Worksop Town and the Priory and containing together 42 acres, 2 roods, 0 perches.

Item, a common called the Lord's Wood belonging to Worksop and Radford and lying between certain sheep walks of the Lord's in the use of Mr John Flower and Lyon Cole in part and Worksop Park in part towards the north and Welbeck Park in part and the King's Forest in part and certain lands belonging to Clumber of the late Mr Bowles towards the south and containing 849 acres, 2 roods, 11 perches.

Sum total 892 acres, 0 roods, 11 perches.

There is also another Common of the Lord's which was not measured belonging to Worksop, Radford, Ratcliffe and Sloswicke and lies between Worksop Park towards the north east and the lands of the Earl of Newcastle called Welbeck Park and Sloswick towards the south west and abutting upon the last common towards the south east and an Intake of the Lord's in the use of Mr Cotes towards the north west.

Sum total of all the land aforesaid belonging both the Manor of Worksop and the Priory is 7923 acres, 1 rood, 1  $\frac{4}{5}$  perches.

#### Notes on the above survey of 1636 made by Robert White in 1875

From the survey the following particulars can be gathered:- that few remains of the domestic buildings of the monastery then existed, and those mostly in a ruinous state. There is mention however, made of some members of the buildings as then remaining but which have now disappeared, as the Kiln house and Granary, as also the Brew house. These were evidently situated near the Mill, their site being denominated 'Priory Folds' which is described as having the Priory land towards the east and Pond Yards towards the west. It is evident from the same authority that the Priory Barn was not here, but a considerable distance from Priory Close towards the south of the Gatehouse in the south east corner of Mare Croft, where some years ago there were remains of a rubbishy old building, doubtless erected on the foundation of the Priory Barn and popularly called the 'Old Tithe Barn'. To the south of the barn were some monastic lands called 'Laith Fields' and again to the south of these was a strip of land, also belonging to the Priory, of about 60 acres, extending between the two roads leading south called 'Arnall Park' and 'Arnall Park Wood', names now faintly lingering in old deeds and maps.

To the north and north east of the church was a pasture field of 2 acres, 3 roods, 12 perches called 'Old Church Yard' and to the east of this a considerable field of 12 acres called 'Ffarmary Yards'. Here then, we discover the site of the Conventual Infirmary, in the field next but one to the Church Yard and which must have been part of this Ffarmary Yard until this land was appropriated for a cemetery, there was to be seen a spot which seemed to have been moated round and to have contained a building. Beyond this, running north and south was a deep depression in the ground which looked like an important boundary dike; this has long been dry. Perhaps this may

have been a portion of the 'Magnum Fossatum' of Richard de Lovetot's charter, beyond which he give the site of a mill to the Priory and accordingly we find from this survey that in 1636 a mill on the priory lands still existed at Bracebridge which is also named on the Charter in conjunction with the 'fossatum': 'totum videlicet situm ville de Wirksop, juxta ecclesiam, sicut per magnum fossatum claditur usque and pratum de Bersebrigge et extra fossatum sedem molendini cum mansura una'. At Bracebridge also a tenement of land attached is mentioned, called 'Jesus House' which is said to be 'moated about'. A portion of this building remained until lately, and traces of the moat were plainly to be seen. What member this may have been of the Priory is not very apparent.

The road leading from the Gatehouse in this direction is called in the Survey 'Long Wall Way' a name now quite gone, doubtless from the boundary walls of the Priory, 'the large closure waulles' mentioned by Leland. These extended along its north side, probably as far as Bracebridge; indeed, even in modern times, a considerable portion of the lower part of an ancient wall, with an old hedge growing over it, remained on the north side of that portion of the road now called Cheapside leading to Bracebridge.

N.B. Shireoaks belonged to Worksop Priory. After dissolution Shireoaks was purchased by the Hewitt family. They had acquired great wealth as London Cloth manufacturers. Sir William Hewitt was Lord Mayor of London in 1559 – 1560. His brother Thomas purchased Shireoaks and built Shireoaks Hall. At his in 1575 death the property was left to his son, Henry. Henry was a rich merchant and died in 1599 and is buried in St Paul's Cathedral. His son, Sir Thomas Hewitt of Shireoaks. Sir Thomas was High Sheriff of Nottingham and died in 1660. He was buried at Worksop. His great nephew, another Sir Thomas Hewitt, inherited the property. He was Surveyor General of Woods to King William and Surveyor General of Works to King George I. He rebuilt Shireoaks Hall and landscaped the grounds with several fine avenues, cascades and fish ponds, enlarged the deer part and erected a banqueting house in Scratia Wood

The property remained in the Hewitt family until it was bought by the Charles, the 11<sup>th</sup> Duke of Norfolk in 1811. The estate then passed to the Duke of Newcastle when the Howard estates were sold in 1840. In 1854 the Duke of Newcastle sank test shafts to locate coal.

Gateford was owned by the de Gateford family. John de Gateford held the fourth part of a knight's fee in Gateford, nigh Worksop of Thomas de Furnival in 1330 and Thomas de Gateford held the manor of Gateford in 1367. The de Gateford family held the property for over 300 years until John Gaitford's heir was his daughter who married Sir John Townley. The property next went to the Lascelles family. In 1636 Sir George Lascelles is mentioned in John Harrison's survey.

However, these are not now shared equally between tenants as they had been originally, and although in some cases farmers were able to consolidate their land into adjoining parcels, others rented small areas of land over a wide area. So small farms or smallholdings were now starting to be created from the original strip system.
